Chateaubriand Fellowships (Embassy of France)

The Chateaubriand Fellowship is a grant offered by the Embassy of France in the United States. It supports outstanding Ph.D. students from American universities who wish to conduct research in France for a period ranging from 4 to 9 months.

- Landidates must be currently working on their Ph.D.
- ▶ Candidates do not have to be U.S. citizens, but they must be enrolled in an American university. However, French citizens are not eligible to apply.
- ▶ Candidates must obtain a letter of agreement from their advisor(s) in the U.S., as well as a letter of invitation from a professor affiliated with a French university or research institution.

Deadline: mid-January

NSF DDRIG (National Science Foundation)

The Doctoral Dissertation Research Improvement Grants funding opportunity is designed to improve the quality of dissertation research. DDRIG awards provide funds for items not normally available through the student's university such as enabling doctoral students to undertake significant data-gathering projects and to conduct field research in settings away from their campus. DDRIGs do not provide cost-of-living or other stipends or tuition. Outstanding DDRIG proposals specify how the knowledge to be created advances science of science.

Deadlines: February and September

Language Learning Dissertation Grant Program

The Language Learning Dissertation Grant Program supports the dissertation research of doctoral candidates in the language sciences. The grant is designed to cover actual expenses — up to \$2,000 per grant, connected with the research component of the dissertation (e.g., travel for data collection, essential equipment, compensation for participants, materials) — that have not yet been spent prior to the date of the application.

The purpose of the American Dissertation Fellowship is to offset a scholar's living expenses while she completes her dissertation. The fellowship must be used for the final year of writing the dissertation. Applicants must have completed all course work, passed all preliminary examinations, and received approval for their research proposals or plans by the preceding November. Students holding fellowships for writing a dissertation in the year prior to the AAUW fellowships year are not eligible. Open to applicants in all fields of study. Scholars engaged in science, technology, engineering and math fields or those researching gender issues are especially encouraged to apply.

The Women's Studies Fellowships are provided to Ph.D. candidates at institutions in the United States who will complete their dissertations during the fellowship year. The most competitive applications include not only a clear, thorough, and compelling description of the candidate's work, but also evidence of an enduring interest in and commitment to women's issues and scholarship on women.

The Women's Studies competition is for projects in the humanities and social sciences; projects in fields such as management, the clinical and biological sciences, and law are not eligible unless they have a demonstrable academic grounding in the humanities and social sciences. Applicants working on health-related issues in the social sciences should consider carefully whether their work demonstrably centers on the topic's social, cultural, and individual aspects.

Gladys Krieble Delmas Foundation (Venetian Research Program)

The Foundation awards travel grants to individual scholars to support historical research on Venice and the former Venetian empire, and for the study of contemporary Venetian society and culture. Disciplines of the humanities and social sciences are eligible areas of study, including (but not limited to) archaeology, architecture, art, bibliography, economics, history, history of science, law, literature, music, political science, religion, and theater.

Eligible applicants must:

- be citizens or permanent residents of the United States* (* Citizens and permanent residents of the United Kingdom and Commonwealth are eligible for Venetian study awards made by the Delmas Foundation's British and Commonwealth Advisory Board.)
- have experience in advanced research at the graduate level or equivalent. *PhD students must have completed all course work at the time of application.*
- be able to complete research before the end of September 2023.
